

**The Work of the Cross**  
**Romans 5:8-10; 6:1-11; Galatians 2:20**

**The Work of the Cross Is Extremely Personal - Heb 10:14; Jo 14:3**

- The aim of the cross: two parties coming together to function as one - I Cor 6:17; Jo 14:20; 17:22-24
- The work of the cross is to make room for the Life of God in us - Col 1:27; 3:4
  - ...an exchanged life - Ga 2:20

**The Severing Power of the Cross: "Let there be death..." - Ro 6:6; Col 3:3**

- To the "Adam" life in us - Ro 5:12-21
  - ..."Adam" life is never saved, it is crucified, terminated - Ro 6:6
- To the sinful life in us - Ro 6:10,11; Heb 9:26
  - ...forgiveness of all our sins - Col 2:13; Titus 2:14; I Jo 1:9
  - ...death to the sinner - Ro 5:19; 6:6-11; I Tim 1:15
- To the Satan dominated, world-conditioned life - I Jo 3:8; 4:4; Ga 6:14; I Jo 5:4,5
  - ...delivered from the authority of darkness - Col 1:13

**The Enlivening/Enabling Power of the Resurrection: "Let there be life..." - Ro 5:10; 6:4; II Cor 5:17**

- God Life in us - Col 1:27; 3:4
  - ...an indivisible fellowship - Ro 8:35ff; Heb 13:5
- Holy, Righteous, Sinless Life in us - II Cor 5:21; Eph 1:4; I Jo 3:5
  - ...we have holy, righteous, sin-conquering options in us - II Pet 1:3,4; I Jo 5:3
- Satan-defeating, world-overcoming Life in us - Jo 14:30; 16:33
  - ...body and soul are not off-limits to the devil, but spirit is - I Jo 5:18
  - ...none of the devil's/the world's "negatives" can "negate" His Life in us - II Cor 2:14; Jo 16:33; I Jo 4:4
