The Feast of Tabernacles: A Feast of <u>Historical</u> and <u>Agricultural</u> Significance - Lev 23:39-43

- Thanksgiving festival for God's supply Ex 23:16
- Jesus diverts their attention from the festival to Himself Jo 7:37
 - ..." I AM God's Supply! (the <u>fulfillment</u> of this festival)

The Invitation: Jo 7:37

- "If anyone" = open to <u>all</u> who are thirsty
- "Let him" = the need for <u>individual</u> response
- "Come to Me and drink = it is always <u>personal</u>
 - ...take Me into yourself!

The Result: Jo 7:38

- We are filled and flooded with God's life
 - ...water as a picture of God's <u>provision</u> Is 32:15; 44:3; 55:1; 58:11; Ezk 47:1-12; Zech 13:1; 14:8
 - ...God will satisfy thirst and provide for fruitfulness with the gift of Himself
- Holy Spirit is a "He", not and "it" Jo 14:16-17, 20
 - ...a distinguishing mark of the New Covenant children of God Acts 1:8; 2:4
 - ... His purpose is to reproduce the character of Christ
 - ...to do so in us and through us

Decision Time: Jo 7:40-43

- Will I receive Him? Jo 1:12
- Will I recognize He lives in me? Ro 8:9,14
- Will I repent of going to other "rivers" to satisfy my thirst? Eph 5:18
- Will I release by faith His rivers of living water for the sake of others? Jo 7:38
