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"Jesus Is Enough"

Jesus Christ is Truth in Person (Jo 1:14, 17). He is the substance, the content(s) of all Christian teaching (Eph 4:20,21). When God wanted to speak the fullness of Truth to the human race He sent His Son, Jesus of Nazareth, the Messiah. He is the definitive Truth on all things True and Real. He is eternal, unchanging, absolute (Heb 13:8; Ja 1:17). (As opposed to the religious fads, theological trends, and philosophical opinions that have the "shelf life" of warm milk!). Therefore, if something is not true for everyone, everywhere, for all time, you may want to question if it is "full of Christ". He is our unchanging standard for all valuation (Col 3:17). To pursue Truth apart from Jesus Christ is to pursue a lie (II Tim 4:3-4). This is why He has the pre-eminence, the first pace in everything real and true (Col 1:18) – not our experiences, our traditions, our sensory receptors, our soulish interpreters. In order to fully participate in the "enough-ness" of Jesus, all of these must be subordinate to Him, our Teacher of all things Real and True (Ps 119:102; I Jo 2:27).

Jesus Christ is Grace in action. (Jo 1:14,17). He is the activity of God in behalf of man, doing for us what we could never do for ourselves (Jo 3:16). He calls us, He justifies us, He sanctifies us, He glorifies us (Ro 8:30). The fullness of all we need to live as God designed us to live is given to us in the Saving Life of Jesus Christ. To become Christian, to live Christianly we freely receive His Life and freely live by His Life. (I Jo 5:11,12; Col 3:4) The entire journey of living in the original and ultimate intention of God begins with "not I" and is sustained and finished with "but Christ". (Ga 2:20). The "horizon" of the fullness of Christ that we have "all" received (yes, you!) by grace (Jo 1:16) is too wide to take in all at once. The "cup" of His grace is too deep to take it all in with one drink. The "ocean" of grace we are in is too vast to fully experience in one dive.

Each situation, every day we are in requires a fresh flowing of His truth and His grace – a "different" grace, if you will - "grace upon grace" (Jo 1:16). For youth and for old age, when we are accepted of being rejected by others, for prosperity and for adversity, when we bear our own burdens or need to bear the burdens of others. The "enough-ness" of Jesus is always present tense, it is always derivative – "give us this day our daily bread". It is never of "I", but always of "Christ"! The only reason I would live otherwise? Unbelief. Unbelief in the Person, the Work, the ever-present-now Adequacy of Christ. Christ for me, Christ in me, Christ through me!
